Background In 1861, Colonel George Wright requested permission from Oregon Governor John Whiteaker to form a cavalry company in the state, as Wright was commander of the District of Oregon that included the Washington Territory.[11] Wright was motivated by the fact that there were a total of 700 soldiers and 19 officers in the Pacific Northwest at a time when there were often battles with Native Americans. [1] Some volunteers joined up, asked to provide their own horse, but were later discharged when the organization failed before Wright was transferred to California.[11] Lieutenant Colonel Albarneac Cady replaced Wright late in 1861 as United States Army regular troops were returned east for the American Civil War.[11] To replace those troops, Wright sent volunteers from California to protect Oregon from attacks by Native Americans.[1] In response, Oregon then commissioned Thomas R.
